### Dates to Remember:

## Battle of Mogadishu 1993

On 3 October 1993, U.S. forces planned to seize two of Aidid's top lieutenants during a meeting deep in the city. The raid was only intended to last an hour but morphed into an overnight standoff and rescue operation extending into the daylight hours of the next day. While the goal of the operation was achieved, it was a pyrrhic victory and spiraled into the deadly Battle of Mogadishu. As the operation was ongoing, Somali insurgents shot down three American Black Hawk helicopters using RPG-7s, with two crashing deep in hostile territory, resulting in the capture of an American pilot A desperate defense of the two downed helicopters began and fighting lasted through the night and into the next morning, a large UNOSOM II armored convoy consisting of Pakistani, Malaysian and American troops pushed through the city to relieve the besieged troops and withdrew incurring further casualties but rescuing the survivors.

## Operation Enduring Freedom

The U.S. government used the term "Operation Enduring Freedom" to officially describe the War in Afghanistan, from the period between 7 October 2001 and 31 December 2014. On September 11, 2001, Al Qaida carried out attacks in New York City and Washington D.C. Shortly thereafter President George W. Bush declared a war on terror. In response to the September 11 attacks, the early combat operations that took place on 7 October 2001 to include a mix of strikes from land-based B-1 Lancer, B-2 Spirit and B-52 Stratofortress bombers, carrier-based F-14 Tomcat and F/A-18 Hornet fighters, and Tomahawk cruise missiles launched from both U.S. and British ships and submarines signaled the start of Operation Enduring Freedom. The initial military objectives of OEF, as articulated by President George W. Bush in his 20 September address to a Joint Session of Congress and his 7 October address to the country included the destruction of terrorist training camps and infrastructure within Afghanistan, the capture of al-Qaeda leaders, and the cessation of terrorist activities in Afghanistan.

## US Navy Anniversary 1775

The US Navy began as the Continental Navy on Oct 13, 1775, with the Second Continental Congress authorizing two sailing vessels. Some 3,500 men served during Revolution. The fleet was disbanded after the war due to a lack of funding. The Naval Armament Act of 1794 formally reestablished a permanent navy, leading to the construction of six frigates. During World War Two, about 4.1 million sailors were in the fight. Today, there are about 380,000 personnel in the fleet.

## Marine Barracks Bombing, Beirut 1983

The Beirut barracks bombing occurred on October 23, 1983, when a suicide truck bomber attacked the U.S. Marine Corps barracks in Beirut, Lebanon, killing 241 service members (220 Marines, 18 Navy sailors, and 3 Army soldiers) in what was the

deadliest day for the U.S. Marines since the Battle of Iwo Jima. The bombing targeted a multinational peacekeeping force during the Lebanese Civil War. In another attack, 58 French service members were killed by terrorists. The attack was carried out by a terrorist group, and it led to significant changes in the U.S. military's counter terrorism efforts.

### Grenada Invasion 1983

The United States and a coalition of Caribbean countries invaded the island nation of Grenada at dawn on 25 October 1983. Code named Operation Urgent Fury by the U.S. military, it resulted in military occupation within a few days. It was triggered by strife within the People's Revolutionary Government, which led to the house arrest and execution of the previous leader and second Prime Minister of Grenada, Maurice Bishop, and to the establishment of the Revolutionary Military Council, with Hudson Austin as chairman.

Following the invasion there was an interim government appointed, and then general elections held in December 1984. The invading force consisted of the 1st and 2nd battalions of the U.S. Army's 75th Ranger Regiment, the 82nd Airborne Division, and elements of the former Rapid Deployment Force, U.S. Marines, U.S. Army Delta Force, Navy SEALs, and a small group Air Force TACPs from the 21st TASS Shaw AFB ancillary forces, totaling 7,600 troops, together with Jamaican forces
