Yvette and I had a wonderful visit to the National Home for Children in Eaton Rapids Michigan on August 6. We arrived Friday night and joined other veterans from Ohio at the hospitality room for food, refreshments and karaoke.

Saturday morning we joined the caravan of cars and motorcycles for the drive from the hotel to the National Home for Children. Arriving at the Home we were greeted by the 22 families living on the campus. Each District and Post then displayed its unit flag near the main flag pole.



Michael J. Bouchard, U.S. Army Brigadier General (Ret.)

General Bouchard (Mike) had 22 different assignments that included five deployments (peace time and combat) and commanded at all levels up to Brigade in his almost 31 years in the Army. Four of those 31 years was served in the Maine National Guard.

He began his career as a Cold War warrior, protecting the U.S. and our European Allies from a Soviet Union attack across the Fulda Gap, and ended his career as a Global War on Terror (GWOT) Warrior, planning and conducting counter-insurgency operations and fighting

for increased funding to the Department of Army budget.

He began his career in 1985, as an engineer officer. The last half of his career, he was predominantly an Operational and Strategic Planner and Leader. During his last deployment to Afghanistan, he was one of the planners of the surge that embedded U.S. and Coalition forces with Afghan National Police units, and he assisted the Afghan Paramilitary Police Forces with their deployment and support of combat operations in Kandahar and Helmond Provinces supporting British, Canadian and U.S. Marine Corps Forces fight against the Taliban.

On September 11, 2001, when American Airline flight 77 was hijacked and deliberately crashed into the Pentagon, Mike was in a meeting that morning on the First Floor of the Pentagon, just around the corner from where the plane crashed. That day, he assisted with saving the life of his Executive Officer, who was badly injured and burned in the attack. General Bouchard says, "For me, 911 changed my life forever".

He is married to Dr. Traci Bouchard, a Pediatrician at Nationwide Children's Hospital. They have nine children and four grandchildren (two more on the way) and spend most of their time traveling around the country to visit them and traveling to Germany to visit family there. His hobbies include riding bikes, motorcycles, and hiking. He is a passionate supporter of veterans and spends his time in service to others.

He is the President of the Board for Joseph's Coat of Central Ohio, a non-profit that provides clothing, household goods and furniture to individuals and families in need. He is also a board member of the Mill Springs Battlefield Association and Past Post Commander of American Legion Post 38 in Somerset, KY.
